




# International Women in Maritime Day

# Reflecting on a Decade of Fit-Out Meetings: Enhancing Safety and Communication

Back in 2008, following a series of serious safety incidents, our fit-out meetings emerged as a platform for dialogue and action. These gatherings were not merely about sharing past events but also aimed to prevent recurrence and empower our crew members to voice their



insights. What began as a routine safety meeting gradually evolved over the years, broadening its scope to encompass business updates and company initiatives.

As the coordinator of these sessions, Dan Fournier, QHSE Manager's role involves orchestrating the meeting agenda and facilitating discussions. The primary goal of our fit-out meetings is to foster open communication and information-sharing among crew members. These meetings have laid the groundwork for subsequent safety communication tools within Algoma.

One standout moment from this year's fit-out meetings was a discussion about the use of cell phones in the workplace. Crew members from multiple vessels raised concerns about distractions caused by mobile devices—a clear indication of their engagement and commitment to safety. As a reminder to all crew and as per the SMM, personal electronic devices are not permitted while on duty.

The general sentiment among our crew members seems positive, especially regarding the reintroduction of the POINT hazard identification program and our renewed focus on Operational Excellence. A thank you is owed to our crews who have worked diligently to cultivate a culture of safety, empowerment, and contribution. In addition to ensuring that fit-out meetings serve as a forum for collaboration, growth, and continuous improvement, Algoma promises to maintain an ongoing conversation and you can help! Remember, *if you see something, say something!*




### June 25th was the Day of the Seafarer!



# Algoma's 2023 Biofuel Trial Results

In 2023, Algoma successfully trialed biofuels on five vessels demonstrating biodiesel's viability as the fuel reduced our vessels' CO2 emissions by more than 70% when consuming B100! Although we need to further study the fuel's feasibility in the Great Lakes region, including ensuring adequate supply, biofuels hold promise for transitioning to net-zero marine emissions. #### Ingredients for cake

A. 2 tsp baking powder

A. 1 1/2 tsp baking soda

A. 1 tsp salt

A. 1 1/2 cups chopped

nuts (optional)

B. 1 1/2 cup oil

B. 1 1/2 cup sugar

B. 4 eggs

B. 2 cups grated carrot

B. 1 small can crushed

pineapple

B. 1 tsp vanilla

#### Ingredients for icing

1 1/2 cups icing sugar

2 tbsp butter

4 oz cream cheese

#### Method

- Mix A and B ingredients separately.
- Add B mixture to A mixture. Mix well.
- Pour into a greased 9" x 13" pan.
- Bake at 350F for 30-35 minutes.
- Cool on rack for at least 1/2 hour before icing.
